As the demand for tickets well out-stripped supply back in April,

coupled with the fact that the band had such a great time playing at The Chichester Inn, we have decided to offer two nights of this brilliant funk-soul band, whose line-up has collectively performed on records that have sold over half-a-billion copies.

Brother Strut's debut album 'First Strut Is The Deepest' released in the UK at the end of 2013 has already found its way into the CD stores of the USA, Australia and Italy, reaching top-slot in many international music charts.

The band was formed by producer & sax player **Stevie Jones** who was driven solely by his love of funk, blues and, in particular, American soul music of the 1960s and '70s. Jones set out to find some of the finest musicians to work with and believe me they don't get much better than this: **Steve Pearce** (bass), **Frank Tontoh** (drums), **Otha Smith** (guitar), and **Sam Tanner** (piano/vocals), a line-up that has played on numerous hit singles and albums, and worked with many world class artists - from Stevie Wonder to Van Morrison, Elton John to Amy Winehouse.

Nick Harper

Nick Harper is at the forefront of a new generation of British acoustic performers. Son of the legendary Roy Harper, Nick made his recording debut on his father's 'Whatever Happened to Jugula?' album in 1985 and 9 years later he was touring and recording in his own right.

In 1996 Nick met Squeeze front man and songwriter Glenn Tilbrook. Tilbrook was so impressed that he offered Nick a job playing with and supporting Squeeze and promptly signed him to his own label, Quixotic Records. Following tours in the UK, USA and Japan, Nick recorded 'Smithereens' with Tilbrook as producer. 'If imagination, energy and bags of talent were the only factors in making a successful pop career, few would deny that Squeeze man Glenn Tilbrook has backed a winner in Nick Harper... One of the 70s most revered and respected British Soul pioneers - KOKOMO, reunited with 8 members of the original 10-piece line-up for a series of London sell-out dates earlier this year.

Formed in 1973, Kokomo consisted of 4 vocalists: **Dyan Birch**, **Frank Collins**, **Paddie McHugh** and **Tony O'Malley** (also on keyboard) - all from '60s pop sensations 'Arrival'. The late **Alan Spenner** (bass) and **Neil Hubbard** (guitar) were recruited from Joe Cocker's Grease Band; **Mel Collins** (sax) from King Crimson, and percussionist **Jody Linscott** (who went on to tour with The Who, Elton John, Dave Gilmour and more). **Jim Mullen** (guitar) from Morrissey Mullen and **Terry Stannard** (drums) completed the line up.

Kokomo's 1975 debut album is considered a classic among collectors, whilst the band's reputation as one of the finest 'groove' units ever to come out of this country remains largely intact.

Some members of Kokomo are no strangers to The Chichester Inn - Tony O'Malley has played there with his own band many times before but this astonishing line-up is a very rare treat indeed and one not to miss!




